Parents' Guide - Worksheet 11 – Big For My Boots

During this week's workshop, we have talked about how we grow, and where we fit into our family.

Using Worksheet 11

This Worksheet comprises 2 activities.

- Naming Trixie and Tyler's Family Tree
- Constructing your child's own Family Tree

This is one of our more complicated worksheets – it is worth reading through thoroughly before you start.

Activity 1

Trixie and Tyler's Family Tree

AIMS:

- To begin to understand the concept of EXTENDED family
 - To reinforce understanding of how the WWW characters relate to each other
 - To practice the use of scissors and glue
 - To gain an understanding of a simple Family Tree prior to activity 2
1. Look together at the sheet entitled: Trixie and Tyler's Family Tree. Remind your child of each character name. See if they can remember some of the names when you point to each picture again.
 2. Cut out (or with safety scissors, encourage your child to cut out) the character names.
 3. Using stick glue, help your child to stick the correct names beside the correct pictures.

Activity 2

My Family Tree

AIMS:

- To gain an understanding of where we fit into our own family
- To have an opportunity to talk about our family

If possible, have some family photo albums to look through together. See how many of the photos your child recognises.

This is a wonderful activity for your child to ask questions and share thoughts on his/her family.

Either:

- Cut out the people on the page entitled: **All Different People**, OR:
- Use **actual photos**/photocopies of your family, OR:
- Cut out the squares of paper on the page entitled: **My Family**, and help your child draw people to represent your family members.

(if using the photos on the **All Different People** sheet, help your child select photos that represent members of your family. For example – the baby photos to represent any babies in the family, elderly people to represent grandparents.)

Using the **My Family Tree sheet**, help your child stick the picture that represents themselves at the bottom in the middle of the page.

Work upwards and outwards, labelling as you go until you have completed the entire tree of family members.

Don't worry too much if your child prefers to connect family members in different formations.

This is essentially a thought-provoking exercise – if, for example, he/she prefers to be in the centre with his loved ones circling him – why not?
