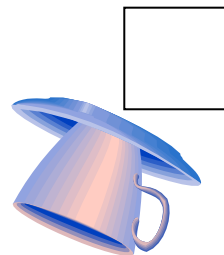
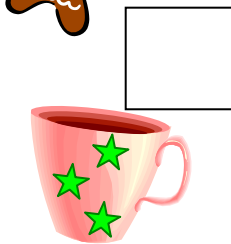
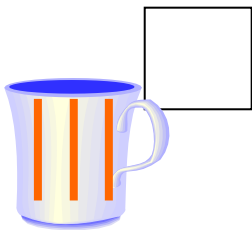
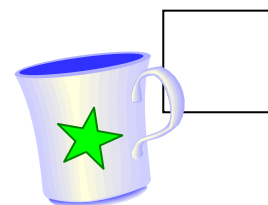
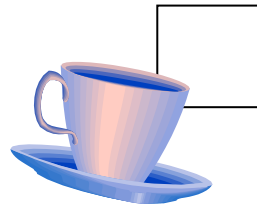
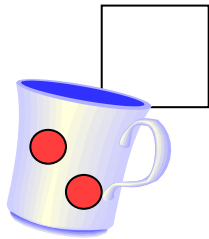


Wiggle Waggle Worksheet™ 4

AN ENGLISH COUNTRY GARDEN

Teacup Game:

What could be nicer than taking tea in a pretty garden? Show your child how to mark a cross in the right box, as you give each **clue** below.



Clues:

1. A blue cup with orange stripes
2. A plain blue cup with a saucer.
3. A cup with three stars
4. An upside down cup.
5. A blue cup with no saucer and red spots.
6. A red cup with two gingerbread biscuits.
7. A red cup with one really big gingerbread biscuit.
8. A cup with no saucer and a green star.

Caterpillar Maze:

- Use your pencil to help the caterpillar follow the green dots to make it through the maze.
- For a trickier challenge – take the yellow 'detours' to collect 3 crunchy cabbages along the way.

Activity Idea: A Garden Party Picnic.
